## Community Rallies to 'Save Sybil'



Members of Reed Memorial Library, the Putnam County Historian's Office, DAR, and Girl Scout were some of the people in attendance at the "Save Sybil Rally."

A rally in support of the restoration of the Sybil Ludington statue on the shore of Lake Gleneida in Carmel took place Oct. 12, where local leaders gathered at the bronze structure that memorializes the 16-year-old female equestrian.

The collaborative event was organized by the county's Revolutionary Putnam Advisory Committee, a body headed by volunteer co-chairmen former Governor George Pataki and philanthropist and local history advocate George Whipple.

Putnam County Executive

Kevin Byrne praised state and private sponsors who are supplementing the \$50,000 he proposed in the 2026 budget capital plan to refurbish the 1961 statue, including State Sen. Pete Harckham, and Whipple.

A petition collected at the event's conclusion is expected to elicit additional funds to be used to clean and update the 4,000-pound likeness of Ludington atop her faithful steed Star.

In addition, the county's department of public works will be distributing and installing reflective metal stars and "Sybil's Ride" destination signs along portions of her 40-mile route throughout the month to raise awareness about the heroine's historic April 1777 journey to warn Patriots – some led by county namesake Gen. Israel Putnam – of an impending British attack on a military supply depot in Danbury.

For county legislator in District 9, which represents Mahopac, incumbent Republican Erin Crowley is being challenged by Democrat Lenny Harrington.

In Carmel, Town Supervisor Michael Cazzari, a Republican, is being challenged by Democrat

Carmel Town Board mema.m. to 9 p.m. For polling locabers Michale Lugo and Robert Schanil Jr., both Republicans, have competition from Democrat Brett Wieland.

In Kent, Republican Town Supervisor Jaime McGlasson is being challenged by Democrat Alex Sewell.

On the Town Board, incumbents Anne Campbell, a Democrat, and Jorma Tompuri, a Republican, are seeking re-election, while Democrat Becca Niitzel and Republican Eileen Olifiers are also hoping for a seat.

Also on the ballot in Kent is a proposal to increase the town's contribution to the Kent Public Library by \$81,809.

In Patterson, Republican incumbent Town Councilmembers Joseph Esposito and Mary Smith are being challenged by Democrats Gwen Dougherty and Stacy Dumont.

## Brewster H.S. Launches Analysis on New York's Cell Phone Ban

Students in Kayla Corvino's Syracuse University Project Advance Intro to the Analysis of Public Policy class are examining New York State's new cell phone ban in schools.

The project challenges students to research how the policy is being implemented across different regions of the state and to compare those findings with Brewster High School's current

Each group will focus on one of the state's 10 regions, investigating three schools to learn how they are enforcing the ban, what consequences are in place, and how students, teachers, and parents are responding. Students will then evaluate which regional approach they believe is most effective and explain why.

The goal of the assignment

is for students to think critically about public policy, how it is created, interpreted, and carried out, while considering the perspectives of multiple stakeholders including students, families, educators, and policymakers. The final deliverable is a two-page policy analysis report that outlines their research, comparisons, and conclusions.

In their analyses, many students noted the balance and practicality of Brewster's own approach.

One student wrote, "Brewster's cell phone policy seems to appear to be the most effective and balanced among the other school districts researched. Brewster's policy succeeds by combining accountability with flexibility; students can face real consequences, but they are also given opportunities to avoid making the same mistakes without any extreme consequences. This interpretation of the cell phone ban promotes responsibility of the students while maintaining positive relationships between students, teachers, and parents."

Another student added, "This accountability system leaves room for students to be able to correct themselves and learn from mistakes.'

To gather information, students used a mix of research methods and personal outreach. They drew on contacts they've made throughout their lives to connect with schools across the state, reaching out to administrators, teachers, and students to learn more about how the ban is being applied. They also examined school websites, student codes of conduct, and social media to find both primary and secondary sources that offered insight into how each community is responding to the new policy.

The project gives students the chance to apply real-world research and analytical skills to a current education issue impacting their own school community.

This project is part of Corvino's Syracuse University PST 101 course, which introduces students to public policy and analysis through hands-on, real-world applications. Students will use this method to investigate problems they see in their community and follow the policy analysis steps to help mitigate these issues.

## **Putnam Recognizes** Pregnancy, Infant, & Child Loss Day

Putnam County held its first to parents who have suffered the officially sponsored Pregnancy, Infant, & Child Loss Remembrance Day ceremony Oct. 15 at Veterans Memorial Park in Carmel. The candlelight vigil coincided with Pregnancy & Infant Loss Awareness Month, declared by President Ronald Reagan with a congressionally backed proclamation in 1988.

The ceremony featured families and area service providers, and highlighted Putnam as a community of support for those impacted by miscarriage, stillbirth, sudden infant death syndrome, sudden unexpected infant death, and other forms of child loss.

Representatives from the county's department of health, department of social services and mental health, PeopleUSA, the Putnam County Child Advocacy Center, Mental Health Association of Putnam, Putnam Hospital, and the Putnam/Northern Westchester Women's Resource Center were among those who participated in the ceremony.

The gathering took place near the park's "Angel of Hope," a bronze statue dedicated in 2003 loss of a child.

County Executive Kevin Byrne directed the county's department of public works to light up the Historic Courthouse on Gleneida Avenue in Carmel pink and blue – colors symbolizing the interconnected grief of parents over the loss of a child.

As a member of the State Assembly, Byrne co-sponsored and helped pass resolutions proclaiming Oct. 15 as Pregnancy & Infant Loss Remembrance Day in New York State.

According to a 2010 study by Dr. Vincent De Brouwere, there are approximately 6.3 million perinatal deaths (miscarriage, stillbirth, ectopic pregnancy, and neonatal loss) every year around

"Raising awareness is critical to prevention and saving lives," said Byrne. "By memorializing Oct. 15 as Pregnancy, Infant, & Child Loss Remembrance Day, Putnam County sends a message that we stand with families in remembrance, compassion, and solidarity as a community of support and empathy."


is entirely in Southeast.

## BluePath Service Dogs Celebrates October Graduates

A Putnam Valley family, as well as the Putnam Valley Elementary School, will each be receiving a graduate of the BluePath Service Dogs program – bringing a sense of peace to children with autism.

BluePath Service Dogs is a nonprofit organization that provides service dogs for people with autism, offering safety, companionship, and independence. Some dogs may choose an alternative career path and work as facility therapy dogs in educational, residential, or day-habilitation settings.

"Graduation day is when countless hours of work and hope come to life," said Michelle Brier, chief executive officer at BluePath. "Each of our placements represents stories of safety, independence, and joy that ripple through families and entire communities."

The demand for BluePath dogs is greater than ever before, as one in every 31 children born today will develop an autism spectrum disorder, according to the Center for Disease Control & Prevention. The propensity to wander or bolt is a hallmark behavior of autism and poses a significant threat to the wellbeing of children affected. Even the most routine trips outside the home can quickly transform into life-threatening experiences.

To avoid disruption and risk, children and their families often retreat into the safer environments of their homes and experience significant social isolation as a result.

Sandra and Don Vogt of Putnam Valley will welcome Linda into their home for their 13-yearold son Devin.

"Linda will be there to calm our son when his anxiety rises, to guide him safely when distractions make the world too hard to manage, and to give him the courage to step into new experiences with confidence," said Sandra Vogt. "Linda will bring a sense of security, comfort, and friendship in ways words can't fully capture. Our son's new partner means more than help with challenges—she means freedom, joy, and new possibilities for our whole family. And that is truly a gift."

BluePath recently celebrated the graduation of two facility

therapy dogs – Mason and Lenny – who provide emotional support, assistance with mood regulation, opportunities for social engagement and connectedness, and increased physical activity.

Mason will be placed at Putnam Valley Elementary School.

"Throughout Mason's workdays at our elementary school, we know he will build on the love and training he has received so far," said Principal Dr. Margaret Podesta. "He will be providing comfort through difficult moments and support through all the transitions where needed – especially in our special education classrooms. We know Mason will help bring these and other children back to baseline emotionally, so they can reset and carry on with their learning day after feeling any stress."

# **Southeast Debates New Building Dept. Position**

The Southeast Town Board it trying to chip away at the tentative proposed 2026 budget that was introduced by Supervisor Nick Durante in September and would raise the tax levy by 10.95 percent.

"I do think percentages are hard to sometimes accept," Durante said at the Oct. 9 town board meeting. "What I'd like to speak to is the dollar amount."

He explained that the 10.95 percent increase would equate to about \$50 in taxes more next year for the average household.

"Southeast has the lowest town taxes in the county," said Durante. "So with such a low tax rate, any addition is going to make the percentage look extremely high. The dollar amount is a much more reasonable explanation" of the increase.

One area the board focused its discussion on is the building department, in which Durante has proposed a new full-time assistant building inspector at a salary of \$110,000. He said the hope is that when the current inspector retires, this person will be able to step into that position seamlessly. In the meantime, they can also help manage the increased workload in that department.

While Durante had originally also proposed two other positions in the building department, he has since removed them from the budget.

Part-time Zoning Enforcement Officer Peter Bell said the department is in need of more staff. "My opinion is you need three or at least two and a half (employees)," he said. "But I think there is enough work for three and a half."

Board members said it would behoove the town to consider making a change to operations within the department before hiring more staff.

"There has to be an easier way, if your process is slowing every-body down," said Councilwoman Wendy Lewis. "Maybe it's more efficient that we look at the process and see if there's technology, or just a more streamlined way to do it. And we're not saying somebody's not needed, but we need to look in

all areas.

Councilman Eric Larca agreed that the current processes are complicated.

"Maybe there's a simpler way to do a building permit," he suggested, noting that in this day and age, permits should be able to be submitted and paid for online. "These are things that we can do to set us up for the future... I'd rather spend the \$150,000, \$300,000, \$500,000 to get everything online so that we don't have to keep throwing money at (salaries). We need to understand what towns more sophisticated than us are doing."

Bell said an online payment option would make the department much more efficient, as would digitizing files. However, he said the department is still understaffed —and will continue to be in the time it takes to update operations.

"There is no question in my mind, at all, that that (additional) person is needed," he said. "Every one of our inspectors, including the building inspector, is booked very single day."

Councilman Alex Mazzotta said a shift in the department's operations needs to happen, which may include changing what the actual permit looks like, putting documents online, and accepting credit card payments online.

"All these things have to be done first, in my opinion, before we consider another body," he said. "I wouldn't be comfortable investing in another person until we've demonstrated that these items have been completed, and then if we're still in the position of being overwhelmed, then I'd support it."

Councilman Eric Cyrpus suggested the town start the process to bring the building department into more modern times.

"We're not going to have the most efficient building department, with all the new software up and running, in just six months," he said. "But we need to be committed to getting there because we've been trying to get there for the past several years and we've never taken the first step."

No decision was made on the position.

When it comes to revenue, one line item that is up in the air is how much the town will be receiving from the sales-tax-sharing agreement with the county, although early estimates suggested Southeast will receive about \$350,000 – which board members said will go far.

"Say we get \$350,000," explained Cyprus. "Let's say \$175,000 is for a brand new wish list project that we never would have thought of, and maybe \$175,000 of it is something we were already going to do next year and we offset it with this money. That's \$175,000 (taken) out of the tax cap."

A public hearing on the budget is scheduled Nov. 6 at 7 p.m. at Southeast Town Hall. To view the tentative proposed budget, visit southeast-ny.gov/415/2026-Budget.

## **Nutrition Corner**

## **Sheet Pan Meals**

As schedules fill with school activities and fall gets busier, we need simple, satisfying meals that don't create more work. Sheet pan meals check all the boxes: they're quick to prep, full of flavor, and easy to clean up. Done right they easily lead to a balanced meal-often combining protein, vegetables, and starches in one pan—while saving time and effort in the kitchen.

Cook Time and Temp

Sheet pan ingredients may need different cooking times. Keep this in mind when building your sheet pan (or pans, if batch cooking). For example, thin slices of chicken may be cooked in 20-25 minutes, while some root vegetables may need double that time. Likewise, cooking temperatures may vary (generally 375-425 degrees). To manage different cooking times and temperatures, consider when to add food to the oven and how to adjust the temperature to reach the desired texture for vegetables and ensure proteins (meat, chicken, fish) are fully cooked. Try not to overcrowd your pans and aim for a single layer for even cooking.

Preparing Ingredients

In addition to time and temperature, consider the size of the ingredients you're adding to your sheet pan. Aim for uniform sizes of ingredients that will be cooked at the same time. Keep in mind that smaller pieces will not only cook faster but may not hold their shape as well following cooking (a consideration if you will be mixing ingredients or stirring them together after cooking). Lastly, consider the texture and flavor you're seeking. For example, if you're looking for a crispy coating, then adding cornstarch before breading or seasoning may help. Or take advantage of sauces and seasonings to develop different flavors. Sometimes just olive oil and a little salt and pepper is all you need.

> Spaghetti Squash with Buffalo Shrimp (1 Guiding Stars) Hannaford.com

Spaghetti squash and shredded carrots transform this classic bar appetizer into a better-for-you sheet pan dinner. Top it with tangy blue cheese crumbles to balance out the heat.

Ingredients:

- 2 medium spaghetti squash
- 3 Tbsp. olive oil, divided
- 1 lb. raw peeled, deveined large shrimp
  - 4 medium carrots, shredded 1/4 cup hot sauce
  - 2 Tbsp. apple cider vinegar
  - 1/2 (4-oz.) container crumbled
    - 3 green onions, thinly sliced

Directions:

Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Line a large rimmed baking sheet with parchment. With a very sharp chef's knife, cut each squash in half lengthwise. With spoon, scrape out and discard seeds.

Brush cut-sides of squash with 2 tablespoons oil and place cut-sides down on prepared pan. Poke holes in squash peel. Roast 40 minutes.

In a medium bowl, toss shrimp and shredded carrots with remaining 1 tablespoon oil. Season with salt and pepper. Scatter shrimp on pan around squash. Roast until shrimp are cooked through, 15 minutes. Remove from oven and turn squash cut-sides up to cool slightly.

While squash cools, in a large bowl, stir together hot sauce and vinegar. Add shrimp and carrots. Toss to combine. Season with salt

With a fork, scrape squash from peel to separate strands. Divide shrimp mixture among squash. Garnish with blue cheese and green



The Scholastic Book Fairs,


three Carmel Central School District elementary schools in October, were about more than reading. They were an exercise in math and decision-making, and they gave


